Homily for the Second Sunday of Easter (Divine Mercy Sunday)

Last week we meditated on Christ's death and His wounds borne for our sake. Today, joyful with the news of his resurrection we celebrate our triumph over sin and death.

On this second Sunday, Jesus bestowed important gifts of faith and peace to the disciples and commissioned them as sacramental ministers of penance.

In the light of what we read in the gospel of today, we know that healing does not erase our wounds, as if they never happened. Rather, healing transforms them so that they no longer weigh us down. We rejoice today that the Lord has power to revive our courage and Faith. No locked door, nor even locked hearts could keep him out. Although we cannot go to mass nor receive the sacraments, may we remain open to Christ who is still with us wherever we are. Remember what he said; blessed are those who have not seen and yet believe (John 20:29).

May God strengthen our faith and bless us with hope so that we might live a life of love and mercy. Happy Sunday, and remember that the Lord is with us!
