Newsletter for the week of April 18th 2021

Please Note: Masses will resume at our 3 parishes starting this Saturday at 7pm in Levack. The Parish Office is closed to the public during this lockdown.

Information from our Public Health Office.

Please, adhere to the following advice:

- the importance of active screening everyone who enters our parishes (this requires a volunteer asking screening questions)
- the value of at least 6' between people (not between pews a body adds about 1' of space)
- hand sanitizer before entry into church and before communion (please bring your own from home if possible to use before communion. If you forget, please proceed to the back of the church to sanitize your hands first and then you can receive communion from Fr. Joseph)
- no congregational singing
- and a solid exit strategy so that people are at least 6' apart. Please remain in your pew until you can remain 6 feet away from the next parishioner.

We cannot emphasize enough how valuable these measures are, especially at a time when variants of concern are in the communities served by our diocese.

Five Things of which to be mindful

A GENERAL DISPENSATION FROM THE SUNDAY OBLIGATION WILL REMAIN. The dispensation for the obligation to attend Mass will remain in effect. Because of this, the live-streaming of Masses will continue for those who are not able to attend at their churches/parish.

Attendance will be limited. The maximum capacity of each church is reduced to 15% fire code capacity, or fewer if required to ensure physical distancing.

Physical Distancing must be consistently practiced. Expect that your parish church will have pews/rows that are sectioned off, and that family groups and individuals will be asked to keep at least two meters (six feet) distance from each other. Wear a mask to Mass to guard against germ spread. Anyone presenting symptoms of illness or who have travelled out of country in the past 14 days is directed to stay home.

Liturgical changes will be in place. Similar to protocols established when churches were closing, extra precautions will be taken. Temporary adjustments will be made with respect to how we celebrate Mass and receive Holy Communion.

There still will be a risk for anyone who attends a public Mass. Even with best health practices and strict physical distancing, anyone who enters a public space should recognize there is a risk of contracting the corona virus. Improved cleaning will occur in our churches, but no one should expect that they will be any safer from germs than in other public spaces.

Third Sunday after Easter

Today Jesus appeared to the disciples and offered them the gifts of peace and of forgiveness. He greeted them by saying: peace be with you. Because they did not immediately recognise him, he showed them his feet and hands in reassurance. He also assured them of his forgiveness and commissioned them to go to all the nations to preach the repentance and the forgiveness of sins.

In the first reading, Peter did exactly that. After criticising the people for their role in the crucifixion and death of Jesus, he assured them of God's forgiveness if they were ready to repent. Those who accepted this message were added to the number of believers.

The church has been faithful to her mission of preaching the repentance and the forgiveness of sin. In the eyes of God, it is always a good time for a new beginning. We pray for the humility to admit our guilt. May the mystery we celebrate today help us regret and ask forgiveness for our sins. Amen!
